	Egypt embarked on its journey to decarbonise its electricity sector through the introduction of different schemes aimed at incentivising private sector participation in the renewable energy generation business. As a result, Egypt today has around 6 GW of installed renewable energy capacity, of which c. 2 GW has been developed by the private sector, which contributes positively towards the government's national target of achieving 20% of renewables in 2022 and 42% by 2030. Moreover, in line with Egypt's plan to decarbonise the industrial sectors under the framework of the 2015 Paris Agreement, the government is in the process of developing its national hydrogen strategy with a plan to establish a green hydrogen market in Egypt. This aims to capitalize on relative advantages Egypt has for green hydrogen production, namely its geographical proximity and access to exceptional wind and solar resources.
